**MOTION FOR ENLARGEMENT OF TIME**

The Real Property, Probate and Trust Law Section of The Florida Bar (hereinafter the “RPPTL Section”), as Petitioner to the Standing Committee on the Unlicensed Practice of Law of The Florida Bar (hereinafter the “UPL Standing Committee”), moves this honorable court to extend by thirty (30) days the time within which it may file objections to portions of the referenced Proposed Advisory Opinion (FAO #2012-2) and a supporting brief in this Court. If this Motion is granted, the new filing deadline will be July 15, 2013. As good cause for the requested extension, the RPPTL Section states the following:

1. Pursuant to Rule 10-9.1 of the Rules Regulating The Florida Bar, on or about March 28, 2012, the RPPTL Section petitioned the UPL Standing Committee for an advisory opinion concerning certain activities of community association managers licensed pursuant to Part VIII of Chapter 468 of the Florida Statutes.

2. On May 15, 2013, after public notice and a hearing, the UPL Standing Committee issued its Proposed Advisory Opinion, FAO#2012-2, and filed it in this court.

3. Pursuant to Rule 10-9.1(g)(3) of the Rules Regulating The Florida Bar, the RPPTL Section has a period of 30 days from the filing of the Proposed Advisory Opinion within which to file objections to that Opinion and a brief in support of the objections. The current filing deadline is June 14, 2013. That Rule further provides that this court may grant a reasonable extension.

4. As good cause for the requested enlargement of time, the RPPTL Section states that additional time is required within which to accomplish the following:

- A. Completion of objections and supporting brief by its Condominium and Planned Development Committee;
- B. Obtaining approval of its Executive Committee pursuant to the requirements of its bylaws; and
- C. Complying with the Standing Policies of the board of governors of The Florida Bar and RPPTL Section bylaws pertaining to notice and administrative coordination with the board of governors of The Florida Bar.

5. The RPPTL Section has not previously requested or received an enlargement of the time within which to file objections and a supporting brief.

6. Upon consultation, counsel for the UPL Standing Committee has advised that it has no objection to the requested enlargement of time.

WHEREFORE, the RPPTL Section respectfully requests the entry of an order extending the time within which it may file objections to Proposed Advisory Opinion (FAO #2012-2) and a supporting brief in this court by thirty (30) days, to and including July 15, 2013.
