

Re: No revenue of the state shall be spent on experimentation that involves the destruction of a live human embryo

Dear Chief Justice Lewis and Justices:

On November 30, 2006, in accordance with the provisions of Article IV, section 10, Florida Constitution, and section 16.061, Florida Statutes, I petitioned this Honorable Court for an advisory opinion on the initiative petition seeking to amend the Florida Constitution to prohibit state revenues being used for experimentation that involves the destruction of a live human embryo.

While the Financial Impact Estimating Conference, in accordance with the provisions of section 100.371(6)(a), Florida Statutes, forwarded a financial impact statement on the initiative petition on December 12, 2006 by interoffice mail, this office did not receive the financial impact statement until January 12, 2007.

This Court is currently considering its authority to consider the financial impact statements of initiative petitions. See Advisory Opinion to the Attorney General Re: Referenda Required for Adoption and Amendment of Local Government Comprehensive Land Use Plans, Case No. SC 06-521. Oral argument in that case was heard on January 9, 2007.

Pending resolution of this issue, I respectfully request this Honorable Court's opinion as to whether the financial impact statement prepared by the Financial Impact Estimating Conference on the constitutional amendment, proposed by initiative petition, entitled "No



SUMMARY OF INITIATIVE FINANCIAL INFORMATION STATEMENT

Based on the information provided through public workshops and collected through an research, the Financial Impact Estimating Conference principals note the following:

- The amendment is not expected to have an impact on state or local government expenses because no revenues of the state are currently being spent on experimentation involving the destruction of a live human embryo. It is assumed that state-funded research that is based on an existing line of stem cells would not be prohibited. The creation of a line that involves the destruction of a live human embryo, however, would be prohibited. No other experimental procedures that would be affected by the amendment were identified.
- The principals did not identify probable impacts on state or local government revenues because the future development of research and any associated activities that could be affected by this amendment is unknowable; therefore, the impacts, if any, are indeterminate.

The amendment is not expected to have an impact on state or local government expenses.
