**PETITIONER'S MOTION FOR 20-DAY  
EXTENSION OF TIME TO FILE JURISDICTIONAL BRIEF**

Petitioner American Southern Home Insurance Company moves for a 20-day extension of time to file its jurisdictional brief.

1. Petitioner filed its Notice to Invoke Discretionary Jurisdiction on February 20. Thus, Petitioner's initial jurisdictional brief is due on March 2, 2018.

2. Petitioner recently retained the undersigned as co-counsel to assist with filing of its jurisdictional brief. Marvard Trading, Ltd., Doctors Hosp. of Sarasota, John Barnott, and Manatee Cnty.*, Case No. 2D17-3795 (brief due on March 16).

4. As such, Petitioner requests a 20-day extension to file its jurisdictional brief. This motion is made in good faith and not for the purpose of delay.

5. Respondent's counsel, John Bogdanoff, was consulted regarding this request for extension of time and agrees only to a 10-day extension.

6. WHEREFORE, Petitioner requests a 20-day extension of time, until Thursday, March 22, 2018, to file its jurisdictional brief.
