ORDER UNSEALING FINAL REPORT OF THE 20TH STATEWIDE GRAND JURY

The members of the 20th Statewide Grand Jury toiled for almost two years -through covid delays -- hearing from witnesses, reviewing documents, asking
questions, voting to indict several individuals and issuing a (121) page report. The
Statewide Grand Jury was comprised of citizens from Miami-Dade, Broward and
Palm Beach counties. They came from all walks of life, age, gender and race. Their
work will likely be criticized, such is acceptable in a democracy. However, any
notion their work was politically motivated is without merit and belies their
dedication to the task they were asked to perform.

On June 15, 2022, the 4th District Court of Appeal, in case numbers 4D21-3640, 4D21-3641, 4D21-3642, 4D21-3643, 4D21-3644, 4D21-3645, 4D21-3646, and 4D21-3647, ruled on motions for repression or expungement in the Final Report of the 20th Statewide Grand Jury, and on July 27, 2022 ruled on motions for rehearing. The office of the Statewide Prosecutor provided the undersigned a proposed redacted version of the Final Report, which complies with the Orders of the 4th District Court of Appeal. As such, the Office of the Statewide Prosecutor is directed to unseal and file with the Clerk of Court of the Florida Supreme Court the redacted version of the Final Report of the 20th Statewide Grand Jury and this order.
