## UNOPPOSED MOTION FOR LEAVE TO FILE AMICUS BRIEF IN SUPPORT OF THE SCHOOL BOARD OF BROWARD COUNTY

The Washington County School Board (in its capacity as District of record for the Panhandle Area Educational Consortium), the Calhoun County School Board, the Franklin County School Board, the Gadsden County School Board, the Gulf County School Board, the Holmes County School Board, the Jackson County School Board, the Jefferson County School Board, the Liberty County School Board, the Madison County School Board, the Taylor County School Board, the Wakulla County School Board, the Walton County School Board, the Washington County School Board (on its own behalf) and the Florida A&M University Developmental Research School (FAMU DRS), pursuant to Rule 9.370(a), Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure, move this Court for leave to file, as *amici curiae*, a

brief in support of Appellee School Board of Broward County. In further support of this Motion, *Amici* state:

- 1. Amici are the Washington County School Board (in its capacity as District of record for the Panhandle Area Educational Consortium- "PAEC") and its member School Districts, which are located in rural areas of the panhandle of Florida. PAEC is a non-profit regional educational consortium service organization whose creation is authorized by section 1001.451, Florida Statutes. Educational consortia are established to provide joint programs and services to small school districts (i.e., districts with 20,000 or fewer students) which, because of their small size, might not be able to obtain the services otherwise. See §1001.451, Florida Statutes; Fla. Admin. Code R. 6A-1.099(b).
- 2. Amici believe they can assist this Court in its determination of how to apply the aggregate cap in the sovereign immunity statute, section 768.28(5), Florida Statutes, to the tragic mass shooting that occurred at the Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School.
- 3. Amici will provide an alternative perspective to that of the other parties in this case. Amici are small rural school districts with very limited resources. Thus, the manner in which the Court construes the language of section 768.28(5), Florida Statutes, will have an even greater impact on Amici, and other small school districts in the State, than it will on larger school districts like

Broward County. A decision which would make each injury to a student or staff a separate incident or occurrence could bankrupt a small school district, or make it uninsurable, especially if each such incident resulted in a claims bill.

- 4. Amici, if permitted to file a brief as amici curiae, would address whether the claims of the multiple Plaintiffs in this case arise out of the same incident or occurrence, within the meaning of section 768.28(5), Florida Statutes, and will address the broader implications of this issue on its small rural member districts.
- 5. Counsel for *Amici* has conferred with counsel for Appellants and Appellee, and is authorized to represent that counsel for the parties have no objection to the leave sought in the instant Motion.

WHEREFORE, for the foregoing reasons, *Amici* respectfully request that this Court grant their Motion for Leave to file a Brief as *amici curiae* in support of Appellee School Board of Broward County.
