UNOPPOSED MOTION TO CONTINUE ORAL ARGUMENT

Petitioner, the City of Tallahassee, Florida (“the City”), pursuant to Florida Rule of Appellate Procedure 9.300(a), moves this Honorable Court for an order continuing the recently scheduled oral argument, and as grounds therefore states:

1. This morning, undersigned counsel for the City received this Court’s order scheduling oral argument in this matter for Wednesday, August 31, 2022, at 9:00 a.m.

2. The attorney handling the oral argument on behalf of the City, Philip Padovano, will be leaving the state for a longstanding, prepaid, preplanned, non-refundable vacation from August 26th to September 8th and will therefore be unable to appear for the

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currently scheduled oral argument. The trip has been planned for more than a year.
