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**RESPONDENT'S AMENDED CROSS-NOTICE OF INTENT  
TO SEEK REVIEW OF REPORT OF REFEREE**

COMES NOW, Respondent, ODIATOR ARUGU, through his undersigned counsel, pursuant to rule 3-7.7(c)(1), Rules Regulating The Florida Bar, and amends his Cross-Notice of Intent to Seek Review of the Report of Referee and says:

1. Respondent requests this court review the report of referee docketed on December 13, 2021.
2. The Referee found the Respondent guilty of violating Rules 3-4.3, 4.3.4(a), 4.3.4(c) and 4.3.4(d), 4-4.1(a); 4-8.4(c) and 4-8.4(d), recommending a 60-day suspension from the practice of law and payment of the disciplinary costs.
3. The Florida Bar filed a Notice of Intent to Seek Review of Report of Referee on February 10, 2022, in order to seek a 91-day

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suspension and payment of the disciplinary costs.

4. On February 25, 2022, Respondent timely filed his Cross-Notice of Intent to Seek Review as to Rules 3-4.3, 4.3.4(a), 4.3.4(c) and 4.3.4(d), 4-4.1, Rules Regulating The Florida Bar.

5. The subpart designation (a) for Rule 4-4.1 and Rule 4-8.4(c) were inadvertently removed during document revision.

6. Respondent is requesting review of the findings as to Rules 3-4.3, 4.3.4(a), 4.3.4(c) and 4.3.4(d), 4-4.1(a) and Rule 4-8.4(c), contending that the 60-day period of suspension from the practice of law is not warranted by the facts or law, and that the evidence did not support these findings of guilt by the required standard of clear and convincing evidence.

7. Respondent will not seek review of the finding of guilt of Rule 4-8.4(d), though he will argue that his conduct, to the extent it was prejudicial to the administration of justice, was no more so than that of his opposing counsel.

8. The Respondent's Answer Brief Cross-Initial Brief with support for this for review, will be timely filed pursuant to Rule 3-7.7(c)(3).
