Upon consideration of the Report of Referee and the briefs filed in this case, the Court hereby approves the referee's findings of fact and recommendations as to guilt and discipline. Respondent is suspended from the practice of law for ninety days, effective thirty days from the date of this order so that he can close out his practice and protect the interests of existing clients. If respondent notifies this Court in writing that he is no longer practicing and does not need the thirty days to protect existing clients, this Court will enter an order making the suspension effective immediately. Respondent shall fully comply with Rule Regulating The Florida Bar 3-5.1(h). Respondent shall also fully comply with Rule Regulating The Florida Bar 3-6.1, if applicable. In addition, respondent shall accept no new business from the date this order is filed until he is reinstated.

Respondent is further directed to attend The Florida Bar's Ethics School under the terms and conditions set forth in the Report of Referee.


